Project Description

Creation of a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) floodplain study of the upper Cowlitz Basin including Packwood, WA.

The successful consultant will provide the services listed under the General Scope of Services.

Project Background

The current FEMA FIRMs for the Cowlitz River are based on topographic data and engineering analyses that are nearly 40 years old. This study seeks to update effective floodplain mapping to reflect current flood hazards.

General Scope of Work

The Consultant shall develop the new maps utilizing methods approved by FEMA. All tasks shall be completed and all products produced using methods described in the current versions of the FEMA Guidelines and Specifications for Flood Hazard Mapping Partners, the Analysis and Mapping Procedures for Non-Accredited Levees, and County Flood Hazard Management Plan Policies.

The project tasks will also include a robust public outreach component, to educate, inform and involve the Packwood community in the LOMR process.
